

Guidelines for Submission of ARTNeT Book Reviews

ARTNeT aims to publish online reviews of recent policy oriented books and monographs of interest to policymakers, practitioners and academics working in subject areas of international economics, investment and development. *Book reviews are intended to:*

1. Give a clear idea of what the book is about and present the evidence, arguments, methodology and overall conclusions of the book in a fair and accurate manner,
2. Engage readers with an accessible and clear writing style, and
3. Place (evaluate) the book within the wider context of the existing literature and research in the subject being studied.

It is recommended that reviewers avoid detailed descriptions of content and lengthy quotations from the book. Where an extended quote is necessary, it should be indented, and a page reference cited in parentheses following the quote. Book reviews should be between 1000 and 1500 words.

All book reviews should be preceded by full publication information, which should include:

1. ISBN number(s)
2. book title (in bold type)
3. author(s)/editor(s)
4. publisher
5. year of publication
6. paperback/hardback or e-book

Book reviews should be submitted electronically as MS Word Attachments. Reviewers may bundle a set of 2-3 books in a single review under a general theme (e.g. tariff reform, services regulation, trade and gender, etc.) Book reviews are not peer-reviewed but are expected to meet acceptable academic standards. In principle the reviews will be edited only for style. Reviewer's name with full contact details (affiliation, postal address and email) should appear at the end of the review.
